































Floor plans

A first impression

In the Heart of Bolzano This impressive penthouse is located in a distinguished period building from the late 19th century, constructed in Neo-Renaissance style with a richly decorated façade. The property stands in the area known as the "New Town," a district designed by German architect Sebastian Altmann. The apartment was created in 1994 through the high-quality conversion of the attic floor. A range of premium features enhances the living experience, including independent heating, a wood-burning fireplace, a traditional tiled stove, fine parquet and natural stone floors, elegantly designed bathrooms, electric shutters, a security system, and a lift with direct access to the apartment. A stylish entrance hall opens into a bright winter garden, which serves as the central link between the two separate living areas and the spacious terrace of approximately 60 m². From here, one enjoys a stunning view of the majestic bell tower of the cathedral and the surrounding mountains. Facing east, the living area comprises a spacious lounge with large windows and a marble fireplace, a wood-paneled dining room, a fully equipped kitchen with pantry, and a guest WC. The west-facing sleeping quarters, partially under the eaves, include a master bedroom with walk-in wardrobe, a windowed bathroom with both bathtub and shower, three single bedrooms, a utility/laundry room, and a second bathroom. Natural light enters through charming dormer windows overlooking the lush crowns of century-old plane trees, creating a particularly atmospheric setting. Hallways and transitional spaces connect the various rooms in a thoughtful layout. The basement level offers three cellar rooms, while the inner courtyard provides parking for bicycles. A garage in the vicinity is available for separate purchase. The property is registered in the land registry as two separate units, offering the potential for division into two independent apartments. It is a place where northern precision meets southern ease, where Alpine traditions blend seamlessly with Mediterranean flair creating a lifestyle that is both refined and relaxed. Modern yet deeply rooted in its heritage, lively yet serene, Bolzano is home to approximately 107,000 residents from the region's three official language groups: German, Italian, and Ladin. In 2021, Bolzano became the first city in Italy to receive the prestigious "Climate Municipality Gold" certification - the highest European recognition for municipalities committed to climate protection and sustainable development.
